
Planking for Access

Plank size minimum of 240mm x 38mm and at least 2100mm long to spread the load, max 100kg. Planks need to be inspected before use to ensure they are in serviceable condition. If there is any doubt the planks should be replaced.

Planks should be placed, not dropped to avoid damage to the roofsheets.


The roofsheets should be protected from the planks, rags or other similar material will reduce scratching of the Colorbond when moving the planks



Multiple planks may be required to reached the intended area. At all times care should be taken when using planks

Planks should not be used on the overhang area beyond the beam.

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Planks running parallel with the roof sheets, without others planks at 90 degrees, should be angled over atleast 2 roofsheets and extend to within 200mm of the backchannel or beams but preferably over them.

Ladder placement for access to the roof should be in accordance with the ladder manufacturers specifications and near a gutter bracket on the roof.
